THE MINERAL INDUSTRY OF SINGAPORE

In 2019, the production of mineral commodities—notably steel, refined gold, and refined petroleum—represented only a minor part of the economy of Singapore (World Steel Association, 2020; Department of Statistics Singapore, 2021). The legislative framework for the mineral sector in Singapore is provided by the Deep Seabed Mining Act 2015, the Environmental Protection and Management Act 1999, and the Sand and Granite Quarries Act 1971. Data on mineral production are in table 1. Table 2 is a list of major mineral industry facilities.
