



LEGEND

WOODED AREA

- Mixed growth of Engelmann spruce and alpine fir
- Much scattered mixed growth of Engelmann spruce and alpine fir
- Mixed growth of Engelmann spruce, alpine fir, and aspen (yield of spruce and fir under 1000 ft. B. M. per acre)
- Lodgepole pine
- Red fir (yield 1000 to 3000 ft. B. M. per acre)
- Yellow pine (yield under 1000 ft. B. M. per acre)
- One-seed juniper

BURNED AREA

- Lodgepole pine (burned off in about 1879, area more or less recovered with same species and scattered aspen)
- Mixed growth of Engelmann spruce and alpine fir (burned off in about 1879, area more or less recovered with same species and scattered aspen)
- Red fir (burned off in about 1879, yield under 1000 ft. B. M. per acre, area scantily recovered with same species and scattered aspen)
- Patches of Engelmann spruce, alpine fir, and aspen (surviving fire of 1879)
- Large aspen (burned off in about 1879, area recovered with aspen)

BRUSH LAND

- Aspen with underbrush
- Mixed growth of alpine fir and aspen
- Aspen with small percentage of alpine fir, and heavy underbrush
- Oak brush, western service, and choke cherry
- Sagebrush
- Grass land with scattered patches of aspen

AGRICULTURAL LAND

- Ranchland occupied
- Ranchland abandoned
- Alpine meadows and bare rocks
- Sawmill
- Boundary of reserve
