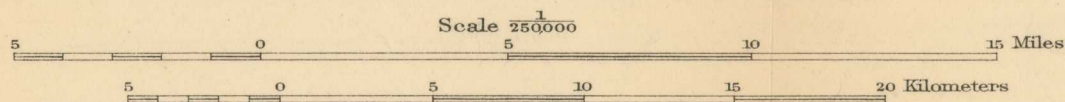

○ Camera station

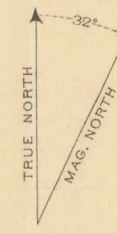


Contour interval 200 feet.
