During the season of 1916 George T. Hawkins extended triangulation northward from the line Absaroka-Billings so as to control the Fåttig 30-minute quadrangle.

Eight new stations were occupied and one point was located by intersection.

Distances depend on the value of the line Absaroka-Billings, as given on pages 310-311, Bulletin 122.

Azimuths depend on Polaris observations made at station Rattlesnake, August 16, 1916. The position of Billings given on Bozeman datum in Bulletin 122 was corrected to approximate North American datum by subtracting 5.3'' from its latitude and 0.0'' from its longitude. Absaroka was then recomputed with the observed azimuth, and points to the north were computed from these corrected positions.
