HAMILTON, HERKIMER, AND ST. LAWRENCE COUNTIES.

The following geographic positions are based on points previously established by primary traverse and triangulation in adjoining quadrangles.

Many stations on the shores of Cranberry Lake were determined by secondary triangulation based on primary traverse points near the north and south ends of the lake. Angles were repeated 10 times with the transit.

The work was done in 1916 by C. B. Kendall.
