


FIGURE 10.—SOUTH END OF FRANKLIN MOUNTAINS FROM EL PASO.  
Showing the abrupt termination of the range, its westward dip slope, and terraced bolson deposits on each side.




FIGURE 11.—SOUTH END OF FRANKLIN MOUNTAINS.




FIGURE 14.—JAW BONE AND TEETH OF TAPIRIS HAYSII (?) FOUND IN BOLSON DEPOSITS SHOWN IN FIGURE 12.
