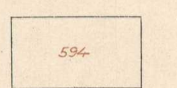

GROSSE POINTE QUADRANGLE

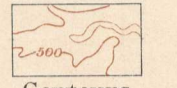

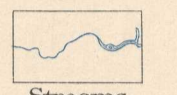

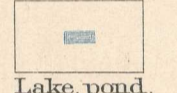

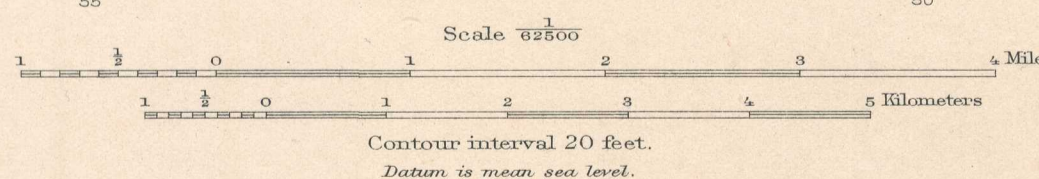


DIAGRAM OF TOWNSHIP
