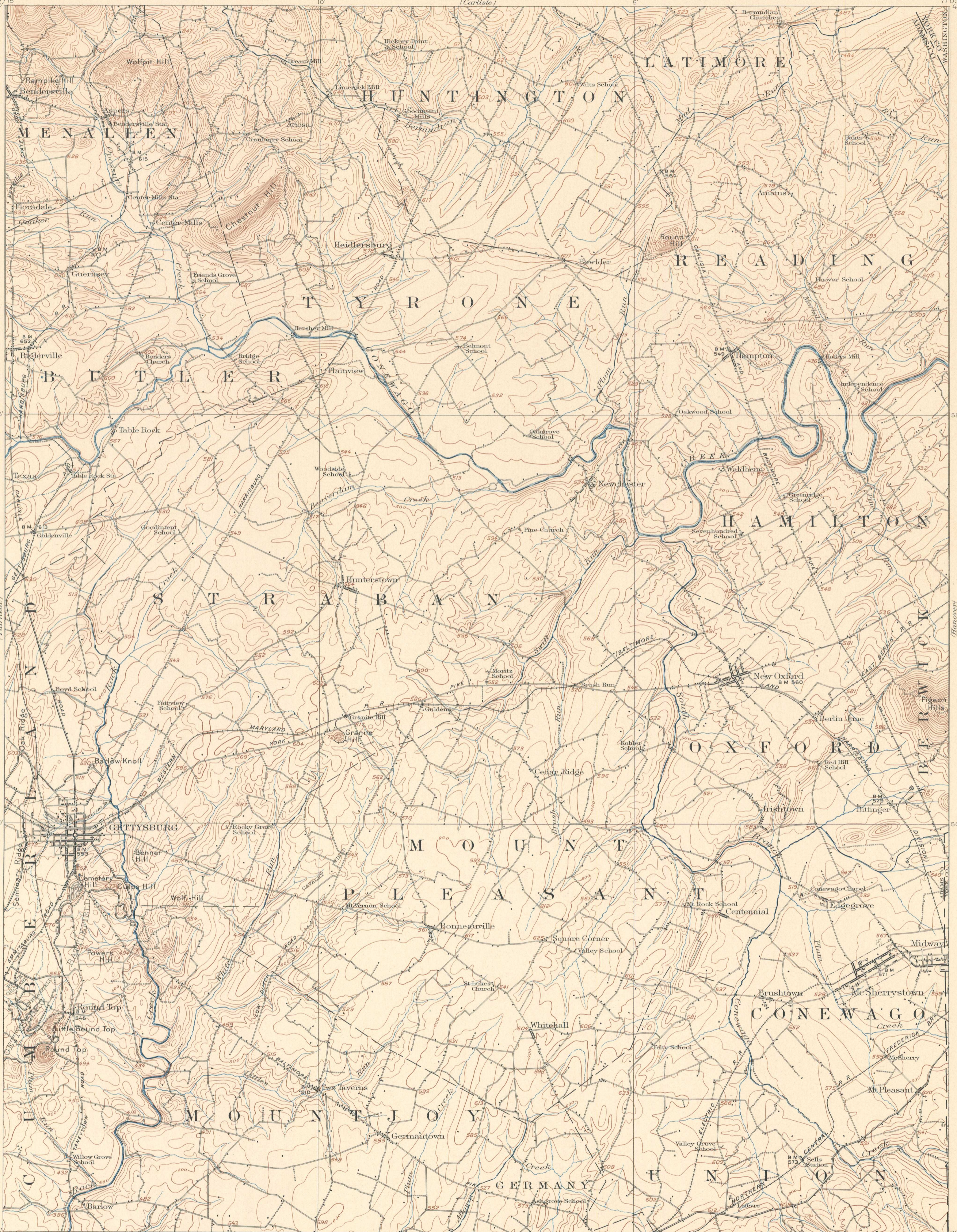

GETTYSBURG QUADRANGLE

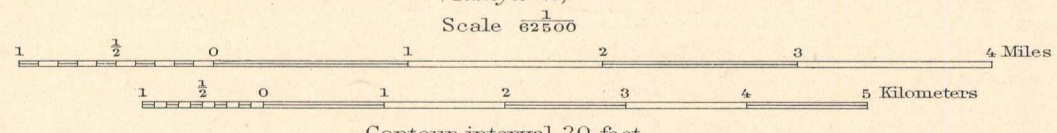
