



# AMERICA OUTDOORS

What comes to your mind when you think of outdoor recreation? Boating? Camping? Hiking or backpacking? Horseback riding? Hunting or fishing? Chances are, if you can name an outdoor activity, you can do it on public lands.

This *Federal Recreation Lands Map* is a consolidated guide to public lands offering outdoor recreation opportunities such as biking, bird watching, boating, camping, fishing, golf, hang-gliding, hiking, horseback riding, hunting, rock-climbing, spelunking, swimming, touring, water-skiing, wildlife observation, and winter sports. Some areas have more recreation potential than others, and types of recreation available may vary from place to place. Many areas include private land that is not open to the public. Care should be taken to respect the rights of private property owners. For information regarding specific activities, services, facilities, hours and seasons of operation, entrance and other user fees, and physically challenged accessibility, contact the appropriate agency offices. You will also find outdoor recreation opportunities in urban areas, such as the cities highlighted on this map.

While most Federal lands with recreation activities are represented on this map, a few, such as military installations and Indian tribal lands, are not. ### U.S. Army Corps of Engineers

The story of the Corps of Engineers in outdoor recreation revolves around water. The Corps operates more than 450 water resource development projects in 43 states. Corps facilities are managed to promote the use of project lands and waters while conserving the natural environment. The Corps' Natural Resources Management Program includes forestry, fish and wildlife management, archaeology, soil conservation, and other ecological disciplines. Outdoor recreation opportunities are available at more than 4,300 public use areas on Corps-managed lands.

### USDA Forest Service

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Forest Service benefits Americans in many ways—through management of the national forests and grasslands, forestry research, and cooperation with forest managers on state and private lands. It offers a variety of outdoor recreational opportunities and special areas on 191 million acres of national forests and grasslands. Approximately 17 percent of national forest land is congressionally designated wilderness providing opportunities for primitive recreation experiences amid spectacular scenery. Facilities and activities are designed to protect the environment and ensure the safety and enjoyment of the user.

### Bureau of Land Management

### U.S. Geological Survey

Although the U.S. Geological Survey does not manage Federal lands, it does produce one of the principal tools for understanding and enjoying those lands: maps! The USGS has covered the country with the most detailed topographical maps available from any source, including special maps for national parks and monuments, which are available from map dealers all over the country. ### Bureau of Reclamation

The Bureau of Reclamation manages, develops, and protects water and related resources in an environmentally and economically sound manner in the interest of the American public.

Reclamation was created in 1902 primarily to help develop and sustain the economy of the West by providing reliable water and energy supplies. Large storage reservoirs, canals, and hydroelectric power plants were built to accomplish this.

The majority of the more than 300 recreation areas at Reclamation's water resources management sites are operated in cooperation with other Federal, state, and local governments. ### Tennessee Valley Authority

Initially designed for flood control, navigation, and electric power generation, the Tennessee Valley Authority's system of dams and reservoirs has become an increasingly popular source for outdoor recreation. This system includes 30 lakes with more than 1,000 square miles of water surface and 11,000 miles of shoreline in seven states. Facilities to accommodate outdoor recreation activities are managed privately or by local, state, or Federal governments. There are also thousands of acres of undeveloped land available for informal use. TVA requests cooperation from the public with attention to safety, courtesy, and resource protection.
