









SURFACE WATER LOW FLOW AND WATER QUALITY

Washington (Le Sueur)	1,565	43	11	Natural	Largemouth bass, walleye pike, northern pike, sunfish.	Has public access. Recently stocked with walleye fingerlings and northern pike yearlings.
Cedar (Scott)	749	16	13	Dam	Rough fish, walleye pike, northern pike, largemouth bass, sunfish.	Carp removed periodically. Recently stocked with walleye fry and northern pike fingerlings.

Clear (Sibley)	526	10	Natural	Rough fish, sunfish, crappies.	Has public access. Stocked periodically with sunfish and crappies. Recently stocked with walleye and northern pike fingerlings.
Curran (Sibley)	500	2.5	Natural	Waterfowl.	Good waterfowl habitat.
High Island (Sibley)	1,624	9	5	Dam	Waterfowl—muskrat.	Periodically stocked with sunfish, crappies, and perch.
Mad (Sibley)	1,051	4	3	Natural	Waterfowl—muskrat.	Excellent waterfowl habitat.
Sevance (Sibley)	599	4.5	Natural	Waterfowl—muskrat.	Affected by county ditch 17. No stocking proposed.
Silver (Sibley)	697	7	4.5	Dam	Waterfowl.	Has public access. Periodically stocked with sunfish, crappies, and perch.
Tilow (Sibley)	924	3.5	Dam	Waterfowl—muskrat.	Has no stocking program. Carp can be removed by permit.
Washington (Sibley)	700	4.5	3.5	Natural	Waterfowl—muskrat.	Good area for waterfowl and aquatic furbearers.

They provide fish and wildlife habitats and are used for hunting, fishing, water sports, and general recreation.
