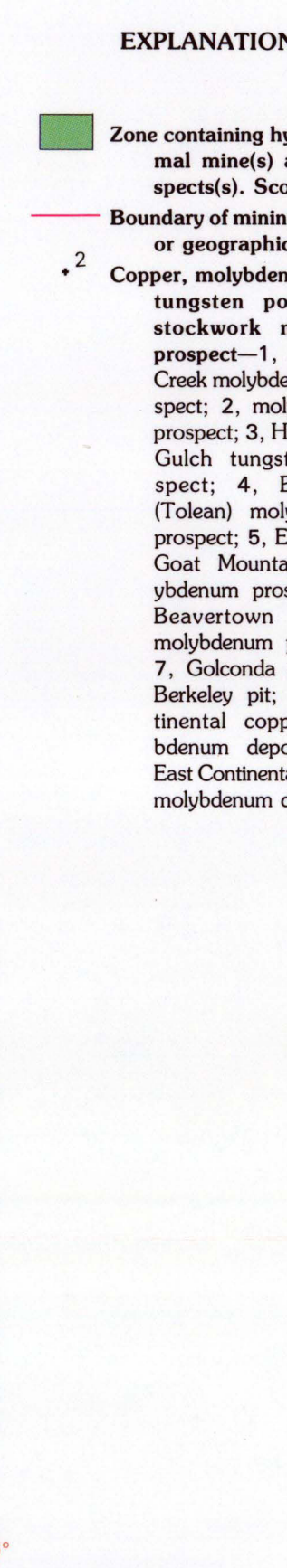
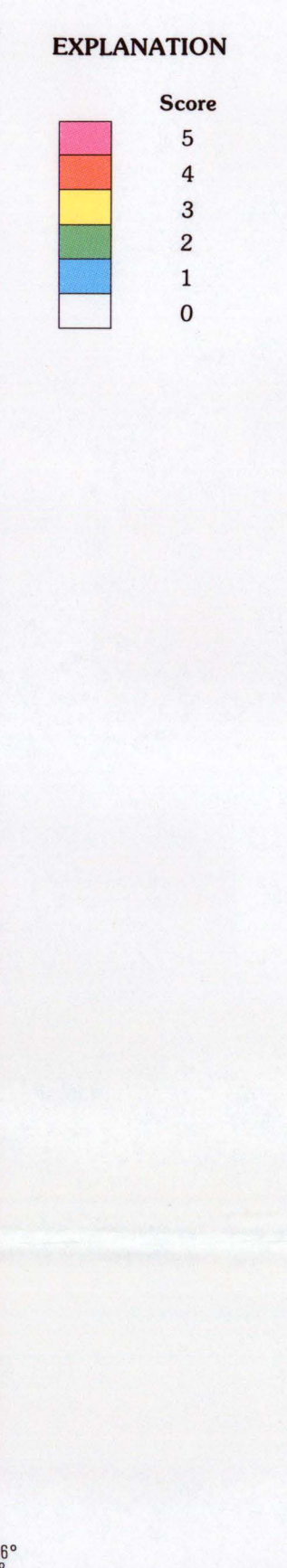


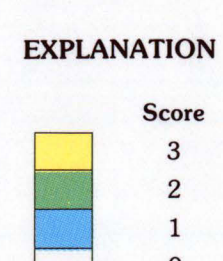
Map C. Generalized geologic map of the Butte 1° x 2° quadrangle



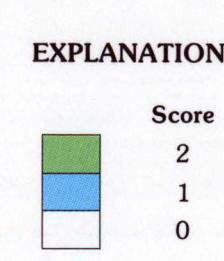

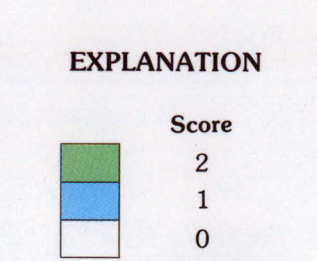
MAP E. Map showing host-rock favorability based on fracture potential



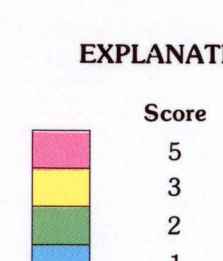
Map F. Map showing favorability based on hydrothermally altered areas



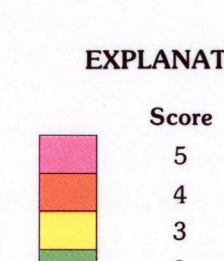
Map G. Map showing favorable zones adjacent to mapped faults



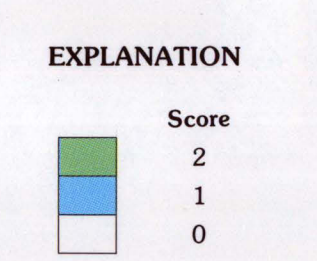
Map H. Map showing favorable zones associated with linear features derived from remotely sensed data
