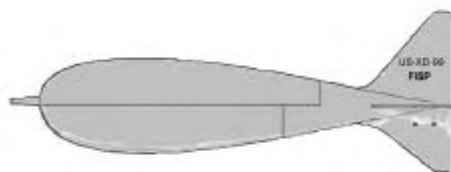

The Federal Interagency Sedimentation Project (FISP) is an independent, interagency project responsible and responsive to the Technical Committee of the Subcommittee on Sedimentation. The basic objective of FISP is to seek solutions to problems within the field of sedimentation that are of common concern to the participating agencies and that are of a nature that solution through cooperative action by the interagency group offers distinct advantages. Areas of interest and activities include, but are not limited to, the following: development, modification, and testing of sediment-sampling equipment; procurement and calibration of sediment samplers; sediment sampling methods; laboratory analysis of sediment samples; and automatic measurement of sediment in streams.
