### THE MINERAL INDUSTRY OF BANGLADESH

In 2016, the production of mineral commodities—notably cement, coal, natural gas, iron and steel, petroleum, salt, and stone—represented only a minor part of the economy of Bangladesh. The legislative framework for the mineral sector in Bangladesh is provided by Ordinance No. 21 of April 11, 1985, and the Bangladesh Oil, Gas and Mineral Corporation (PETROBANGLA) Amendment Act of 1989. Through these ordinances, PETROBANGLA holds shares in any company formed in accordance with Act XI of February 1989 for the purpose of exploration and production of oil, gas, and mineral resources (Bangladesh Oil, Gas and Mineral Corp., 2016, p. 11–12). Data on mineral production are in table 1. Table 2 is

a list of major mineral industry facilities. More-extensive coverage of the mineral industry of Bangladesh can be found in previous editions of the U.S. Geological Survey Minerals Yearbook, volume III, Area Reports—International—Asia and the Pacific, which are available at https://www.usgs.gov/centers/nmic/asia-and-pacific.
