## THE MINERAL INDUSTRY OF BRUNEI

Hydrocarbons were a leading segment of the economy of Brunei Darussalam (Brunei) in 2016, accounting for 88% of the country's exports of goods (Department of Economic Planning and Development, 2017, p. 13, 25). The legislative framework for the mineral sector in Brunei is provided by the Mining Act 1984 edition (chapter 42) and the Petroleum Mining Act 1984 edition (chapter 44). Data on mineral production are in table 1. Table 2 is a list of major mineral industry facilities. More-extensive coverage of the mineral industry of Brunei can be found in previous editions of the U.S. Geological Survey Minerals Yearbook, volume III,
