THE MINERAL INDUSTRY OF GABON

The economy of Gabon was largely dependent on world demand for the country's principal mineral export commodities, notably manganese and petroleum (African Development Bank, 2017, p. 184). In 2016, the country ranked fourth among the world's leading producers of manganese (Corathers, 2018). The legislative framework for the mineral sector in Gabon is provided by law No. 17/2014 and law No. 11/2014. Data on mineral production are in table 1. Table 2 is a list of major mineral industry facilities. More-extensive coverage of the mineral industry of Gabon can be found in previous editions of the U.S. Geological Survey Minerals Yearbook, volume III, Area Reports—International—Africa and
