THE MINERAL INDUSTRY OF BRUNEI

In 2017 and 2018, hydrocarbons were a leading segment of the economy of Brunei Darussalam (Brunei). The natural gas and petroleum extraction industry accounted for 46% of the country's gross domestic product in 2018 and 44% in 2017. Mineral fuels accounted for nearly 90% of the export of goods (Department of Economic Planning and Development, 2019a, b). The legislative framework for the mineral sector in Brunei is provided by the Mining Act 1984 edition (chapter 42) and the Petroleum Mining Act 1984 edition (chapter 44). Data on mineral production are in table 1. Table 2 is a list of major mineral industry facilities.
