### **KUWAIT**

### THE MINERAL INDUSTRY OF KUWAIT

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In 2017 and 2018, hydrocarbons were a leading sector of the economy of Kuwait, and hydrocarbon exports accounted for a significant share of the gross domestic product (Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries, 2019, p. 17–20). The country ranked eighth among the world's leading producers of crude petroleum (Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries, 2019, p. 31). The legislative framework for the mineral sector in Kuwait is provided by Article 21 of the Constitution and law No. 21 of 1995, law No. 16 of 1996, and decision No. 210 of 2001. Data on mineral production are in table 1. Table 2 is a list of major mineral industry facilities. More-extensive coverage of the mineral industry of Kuwait can
