## THE MINERAL INDUSTRY OF BANGLADESH

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In 2019, the production of mineral commodities—notably cement, coal, iron and steel, natural gas, nitrogen, petroleum (crude and refined), salt, and crushed stone—represented only a minor part of the economy of Bangladesh (Bangladesh Bank, 2020, p. 3). The legislative framework for the mineral sector in Bangladesh is provided by Ordinance No. 21 of 1985 and Bangladesh Oil, Gas and Mineral Corp. (PETROBANGLA) Amendment Act No. 11 of 1989. Data on mineral production are in table 1. Table 2 is a list of major mineral industry facilities. More-extensive coverage of the mineral industry of Bangladesh can be found in previous editions of the U.S. Geological Survey Minerals Yearbook, volume III, Area Reports—International—Asia and the Pacific, which are available at https://www.usgs.gov/centers/national-minerals-information-center/asia-and-pacific.
