# THE MINERAL INDUSTRY OF MONTENEGRO

In 2019, the production of mineral commodities—notably aluminum, bauxite, mined lead and zinc, and construction materials (such as stone, sand, and gravel)—represented only a minor part of the economy of Montenegro (Montenegro Statistical Office, 2019, p. 70, 72, 130). The legislative framework for the mineral sector in Montenegro is provided by the Law on Concessions (law No. 8/09), the Law on Mining (law No. 74/10), the Law on Geological Explorations (law No. 28/11), and the Law on Exploration and Production of Hydrocarbons (law No. 62/13). Data on mineral production are in table 1. Table 2 is a list of major mineral industry facilities. More-extensive coverage of the mineral industry of Montenegro

can be found in previous editions of the U.S. Geological Survey Minerals Yearbook, volume III, Area Reports—International—Europe and Central Eurasia, which are available at <https://www.usgs.gov/centers/national-minerals-information-center/europe-and-central-eurasia>.
