THE MINERAL INDUSTRY OF BRUNEI

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In 2020 and 2021, hydrocarbons were the leading segment of the economy of Brunei Darussalam (Brunei). Other mineral commodities produced in Brunei included cement, sand and gravel, and varieties of stone. The real gross domestic product (GDP) increased by 1.1% in 2020 and decreased by 1.6% in 2021. The country's nominal GDP was \$12.0 billion in 2020 and \$14.0 billion in 2021. The natural gas and petroleum extraction industry accounted for 38.6% of the country's gross value added in 2020 and 40.1% in 2021, and the manufacturing of liquefied natural gas and other petroleum and chemical products accounted for 14.2% in 2020 and 17.0% in 2021. The output value of the natural gas and petroleum extraction industry decreased by 4.9% in 2020 and 3.0% in 2021. The output value of the manufacturing of liquefied natural gas and other petroleum and chemical products increased by 25.9% in 2020 and decreased by 8.1% in 2021. Mineral fuels accounted for 81.5% of the country's total exports of goods, by value, in 2020 and for 78.1% in 2021. The significant increase in manufacturing of liquefied natural gas and other petroleum and chemical products in 2020 was attributed to the commercial operation of the Hengyi refinery at Pulau Muara Besar Island since November 2019. The refinery was a subsidiary of Zhejiang Hengyi Petrochemical Co. Ltd. of China (70%) and had a processing capacity of approximately 60 million barrels per year of crude petroleum (Hengyi Industries Sdn. Bhd., 2020, 2022; Department of Economic Planning and Statistics, 2021, p. 11; 2022a, p. 2, 3, 10, 11; 2022b, p. 11).

The legislative framework for the mineral sector in Brunei is provided by the Mining Act 1984 edition (chapter 42) and the Petroleum Mining Act 1984 edition (chapter 44), which was revised in 2002 (Attorney General's Chambers, 1984, 2002). Data on mineral production are in table 1. Table 2 is a list of major mineral industry facilities.
