

EXPLANATION

MINING RATIO CONTOUR—Number indicates cubic yards of overburden per ton of coal recoverable by surface-mining methods. Contours shown only for leaseable Federal coal lands suitable for surface mining methods above the stripping limit.

STRIPPING LIMIT LINE—Boundary for surface mining of coal bed. Limit is 200 feet of overburden. Dashed where inferred.

DRILL HOLE—Showing mining ratio value only for leaseable Federal coal lands. Drill holes which do not intersect top of coal bed or from which mining ratios could not be determined are not shown.

TRACE OF COAL BED OUTCROP—Showing name of coal bed.



To convert feet to meters, multiply feet by 0.3048.


