The surface of the Poverty Flat high terrace was probably graded to the Big Wood River when the river was on the east side of the Wood River Valley; the river was at a lower altitude than that of the Pinedale Bellevue fan. The deposit is probably not older than the diversion of the river to the east outlet valley at the time of the upper Wind Ridge flow. The Bull Lake periglacial terrace is lower than the high terrace and was probably graded to Bull Lake outwash underlying the Pinedale fan. The Pinedale periglacial deposit is still lower and is graded to the present Bellevue fan surface.
