






-  LOCATION OF GEOHYDROLOGIC SECTION
-  WELL WITH DRILLERS LOG; LINE INDICATES PROJECTION TO LINE OF SECTION
-  U.S.G.S. AUGERED TEST HOLE
-  WELL FOR WHICH AQUIFER TEST WAS MADE; NUMBER IS COMPUTED AQUIFER TRANSMISSIVITY, IN FEET SQUARED PER DAY.
-  WELL WITH PUMP TEST; NUMBER IS REPORTED SPECIFIC CAPACITY IN GALLONS PER MINUTE PER FOOT OF DRAWDOWN.
-  ESTIMATED TRANSMISSIVITY OF MAIN AQUIFER IN FEET SQUARED PER DAY - TO CONVERT FEET SQUARED PER DAY TO METERS SQUARED PER DAY, MULTIPLY BY 0.092
-  BASEMENT COMPLEX, CONSISTING OF CONSOLIDATED SEDIMENTARY, VOLCANIC, AND INTRUSIVE ROCKS OF TERTIARY AND OLDER AGE
