ML—Meadowlark

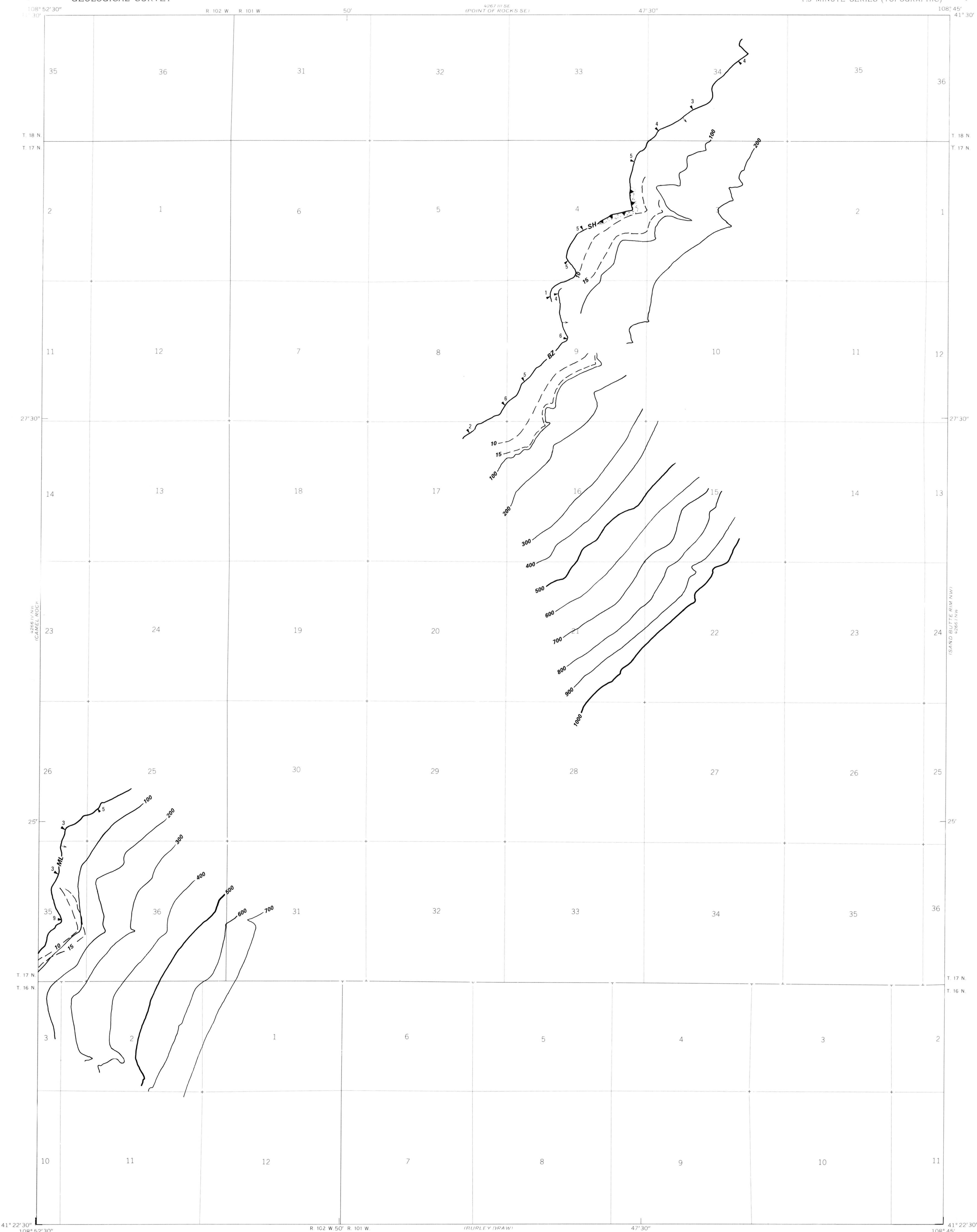
