

KRCRA BOUNDARY

KNOWN RECOVERABLE COAL RESOURCE AREA—Area in which the Federal coal land is classified, (1) as subject to the coal leasing provisions of the Mineral Leasing Act of 1920, as amended and, (2) by virtue of the available data being sufficient to permit evaluation as to extent, location, and potential for developing commercial quantities of coal.



NON-FEDERAL COAL LAND—Land for which the Federal Government does not own the coal rights.



AREA OF HIGH COAL-DEVELOPMENT POTENTIAL



AREA OF MODERATE COAL-DEVELOPMENT POTENTIAL



AREA OF UNKNOWN COAL-DEVELOPMENT POTENTIAL—Federal coal lands probably underlain by coal, but where no data is available to determine a coal-development potential.



AREA OF NO COAL-DEVELOPMENT POTENTIAL—Federal coal lands not known to be underlain by coal within 3000 feet of the surface.




NOT APPLICABLE—Federal coal lands which are overlain by the Seminole Reservoir.


WYOMING-CARBON CO. 7.5 MINUTE SERIES (TOPOGRAPHIC)
