
ISOPACHS OF COAL BED—Showing thickness in feet. Isopach interval 2 feet. Hachures indicate localized thinning.

DRILL HOLE—Showing thickness of coal bed, in feet.

STRIPPING LIMIT LINE—Boundary for surface mining of coal bed (in this quadrangle, the 500-foot-overburden isopach). Arrows point toward the area suitable for surface mining. Recovery factor of 95 percent within that area in this quadrangle.

MINING RATIO CONTOUR FOR COAL BED—Number indicates cubic yards of overburden per ton of coal by surface-mining methods. Contours shown only in areas suitable for surface mining within the stripping limit.

To convert feet to meters multiply feet by 0.3048.


