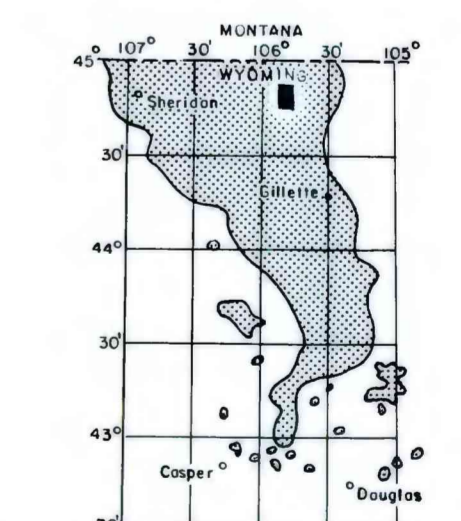
NON-FEDERAL COAL—Land for which the Federal Government does not own the coal rights.

TRACE OF COAL BED OUTCROP—Arrow points toward the coal-bearing area.

BURNED AND CLINKERED COAL BED—Showing areas of baked and fused rock (v symbol). Dotted line indicates the inferred limit of burning.

IDENTIFIED COAL RESOURCES OF COAL BED—Showing totals for Reserve Base (RB) and Reserves (R), in millions of short tons, for each section or part(s) of section of Federal coal land within the stripping-limit line. Dash indicates no resources in that category. Reserve Base (RB) x the Recovery Factor (95 percent) = Reserves (R).

To convert short tons to metric tonnes multiply short tons by 0.9072.

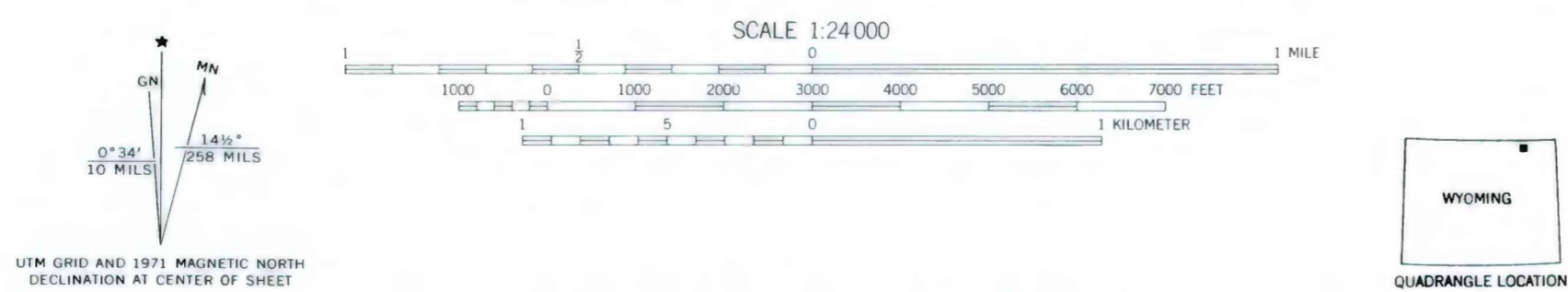
