

EXPLANATION

KRCRA
BOUNDARY OF KNOWN RECOVERABLE COAL RESOURCE AREA (KRCRA)—Area of KRCRA indicated by label.

NON-FEDERAL COAL LAND—Land for which the Federal Government does not own the coal rights.

TOTAL RESERVE BASE (RB) AND HYPOTHETICAL RESOURCES (HYP) OF COAL, PER SECTION—In millions of short tons, calculated for each section of Federal land following the guidelines given in U.S. Geol. Survey Bulletin 1450-B (1976). To convert short tons to metric tons, multiply short tons by 0.9072.


