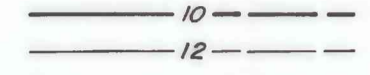
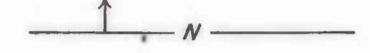

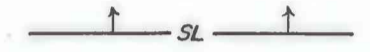


ISOPACHS OF COAL BED—Showing thickness in feet, interval 2 feet. Dashed where coal is burned or eroded.

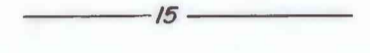
DRILL HOLE—Showing coal thickness in feet.



TRACE OF COAL BED OUTCROP—Showing coal thickness in feet. Arrow points toward the coal-bearing area.

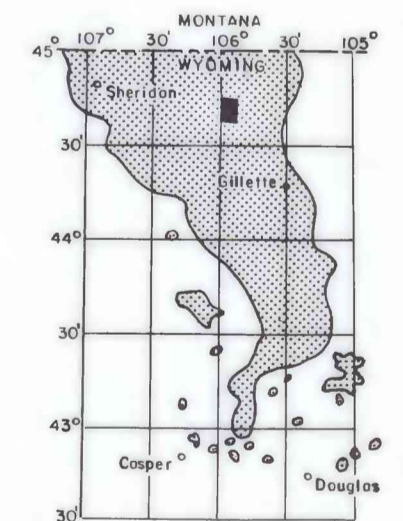


STRIPPING LIMIT LINE—500 foot overburden isopach boundary for surface mining of coal. Arrow indicates area suitable for surface mining.

To convert feet to meters, multiply feet by 0.3048.

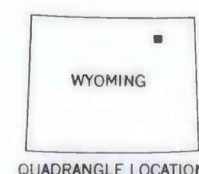
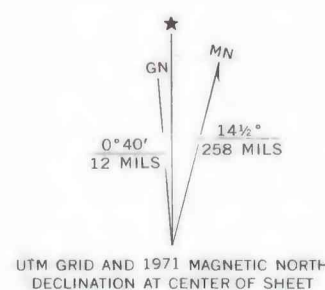
