

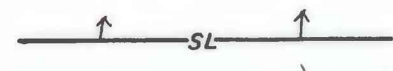

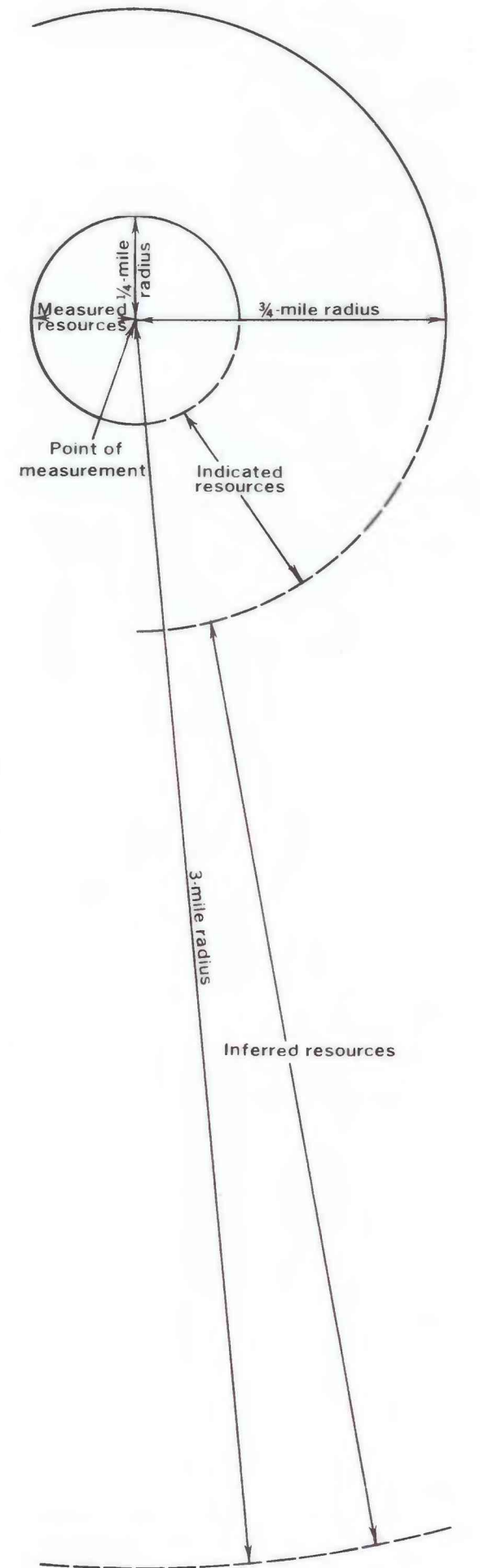
NON-FEDERAL COAL LAND

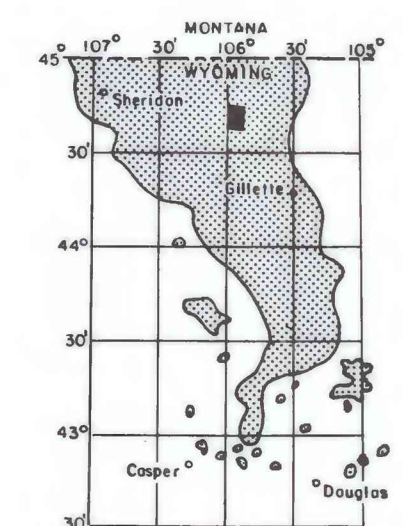


STRIPPING LIMIT LINE—500 foot overburden isopach boundary for surface mining of coal. Arrow indicates areas suitable for surface mining.

To convert miles to kilometers multiply miles by 1.609.

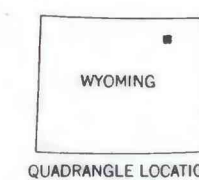
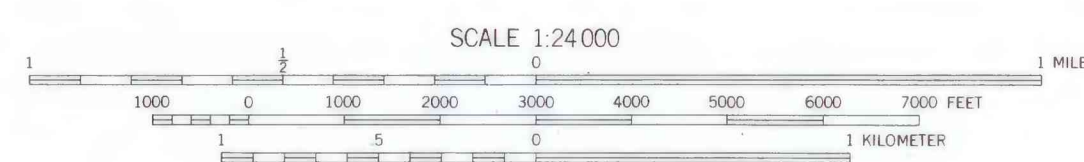
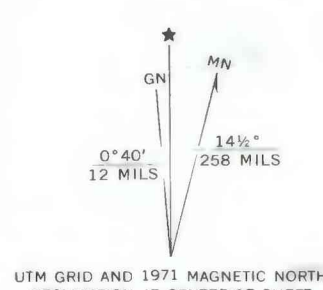
