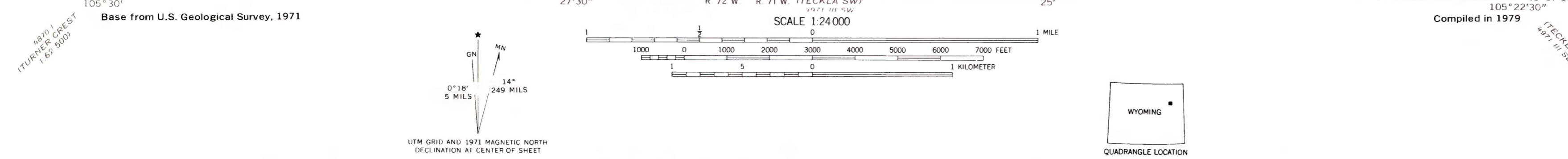
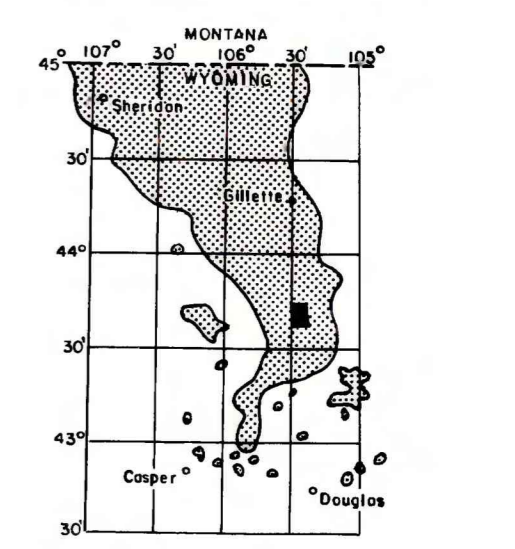
NON-FEDERAL COAL LAND—Coal tonnages not evaluated.

IDENTIFIED RESOURCES OF COAL BED—In millions of short tons. Dash indicates no resources in that category. Reserve Base (RB) x the recovery factor (95%) = Reserves (R).

To convert short tons to metric tons multiply short tons by 0.9072.
