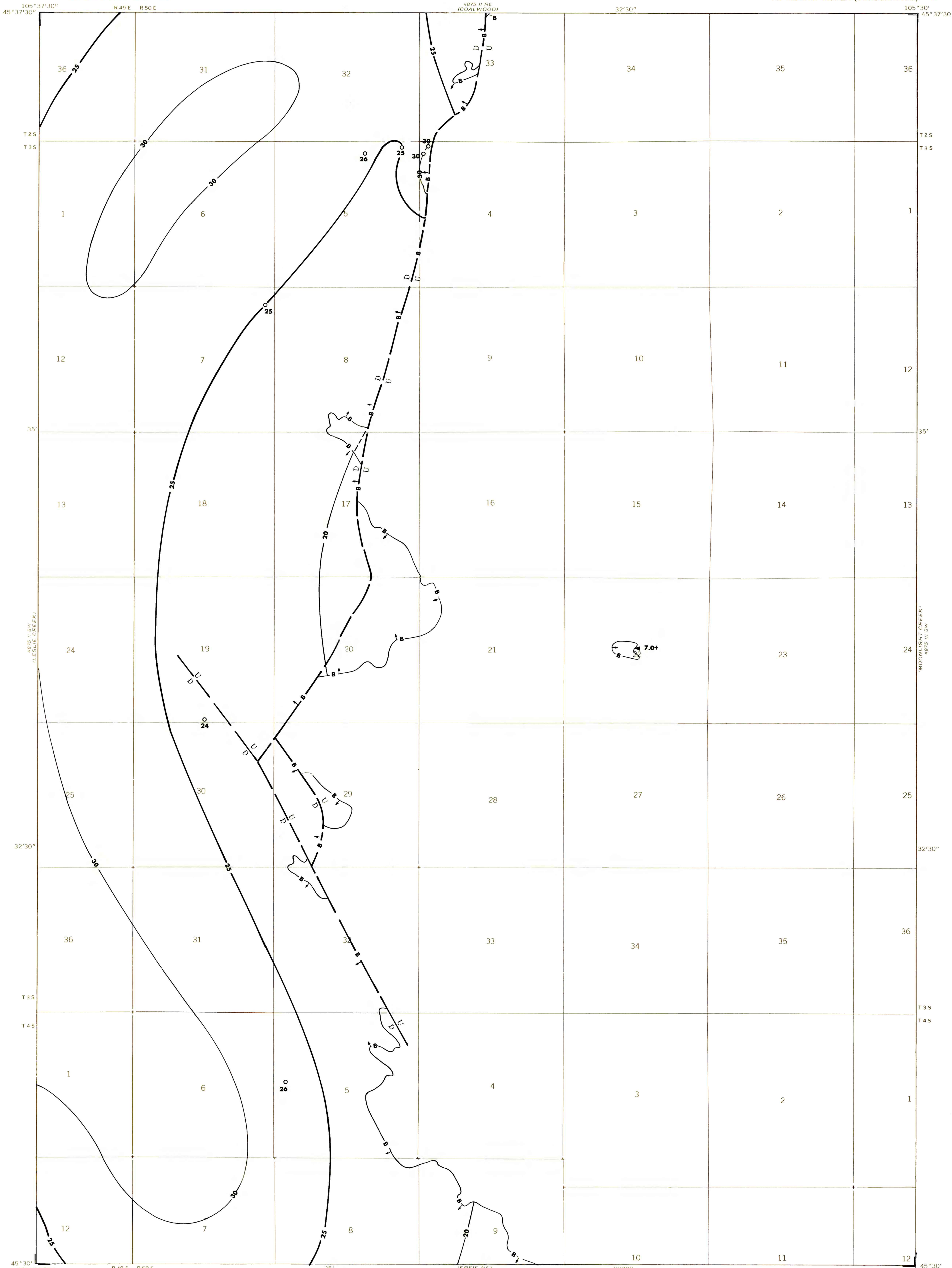

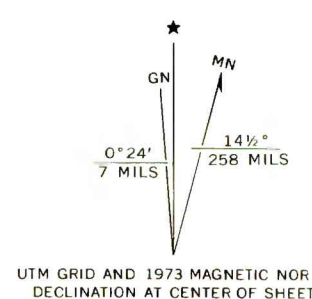

Arrows point toward coal-bearing area. Number is thickness of coal bed, in feet, measured at triangle. Plus (+) sign after number indicates incomplete measurement.
