 NON-FEDERAL COAL LAND--Land for which the Federal Government does not own the coal rights.

 STRIPPING LIMIT LINE--Boundary for surface mining of the coal bed (in this quadrangle, the 200-foot-overburden isopach). Arrows point toward the area suitable for surface mining.

 BOUNDARY OF RESERVE BASE COAL--Drawn along the contact between burned and unburned coal and the fault boundary of coal. Arrows point toward area of Reserve Base coal.






DIAGRAM SHOWING COMPONENT AREAS OF IDENTIFIED COAL RESOURCES--Shows arcuate boundary lines enclosing areas of measured, indicated, and inferred coal resources. Boundaries of areas are dashed where projected from an adjacent quadrangle. Areas of inferred resources may be present on this map without their outer boundaries being shown.
