

EXPLANATION

NON-FEDERAL COAL LAND - Land for which the Federal Government does not own the coal rights, and for which the coal development potential is not rated.

AREA OF HIGH COAL DEVELOPMENT POTENTIAL FOR SUBSURFACE MINING METHODS - Includes areas underlain by coal of the Fruitland I and Fruitland zone A beds. Area has overburden ranging in thickness from 200 to 1000 feet (61-305 m).



AREA OF UNKNOWN COAL DEVELOPMENT POTENTIAL FOR SUBSURFACE MINING METHODS - Includes areas with coal thickness less than 5 feet (1.5 m).

AREA OF NO COAL DEVELOPMENT POTENTIAL FOR SUBSURFACE MINING METHODS - Includes areas inside the stripping limit and outside the outcrop.

Unpatterned areas are FRIA land
