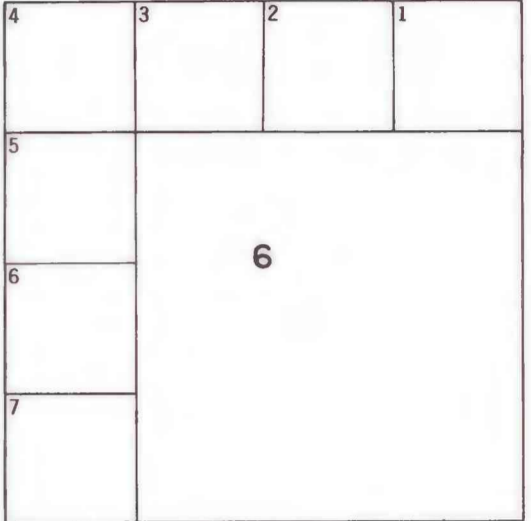


EXPLANATION

NON-FEDERAL COAL LAND - Land within the RECLA boundary for which the Federal Government does not own the coal rights.

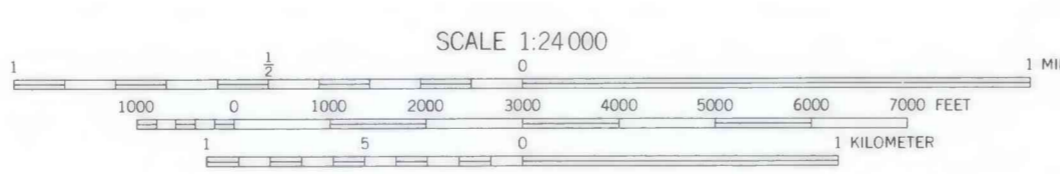
TOTAL RESERVE BASE (RB) OF FEDERAL COAL PER SECTION - In millions of short tons, calculated for each section of Federal land following the guidelines given in U.S. Geological Survey Bulletin 1450-B. To convert short tons to metric tons, multiply short tons by 0.9072.
