DRILL HOLE—Showing thickness of overburden, in feet, from the surface to the top of the coal bed.

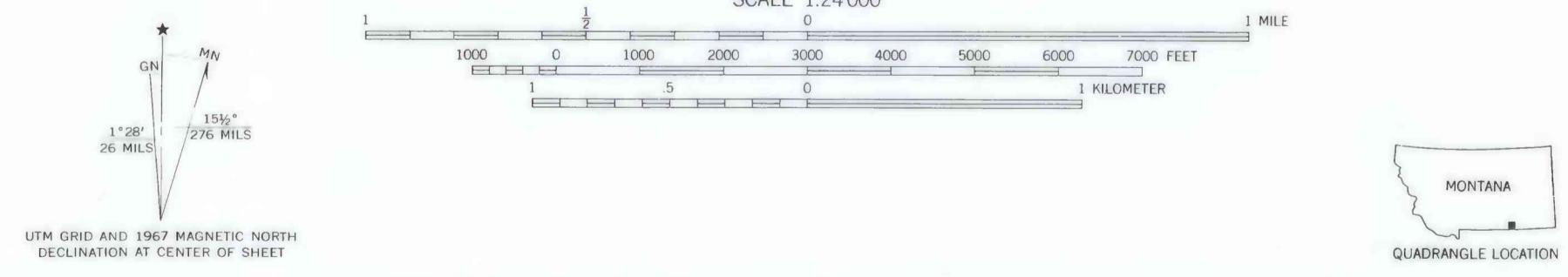
