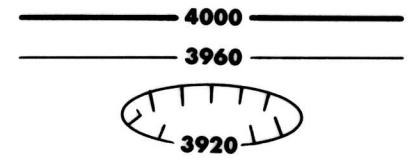
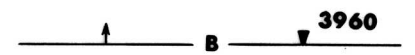

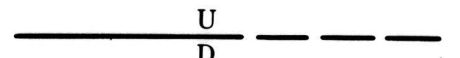

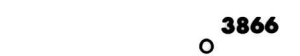
STRUCTURE CONTOURS—Drawn on the top of the coal bed. Dashed where projected beyond boundary of coal. Hachures indicate a closed depression. Contour interval 40 feet (12.2 m). Datum is mean sea level.



BOUNDARY OF COAL DEPOSIT—Drawn along the outcrop of coal bed and/or the contact between burned and unburned coal, and/or the fault boundary of the coal (dashed where inferred by present author beyond the limits of original data). Arrows point toward coal-bearing area. Number at triangle is altitude, in feet, at the top of the coal bed taken from topographic map at a point of coal thickness measurement.

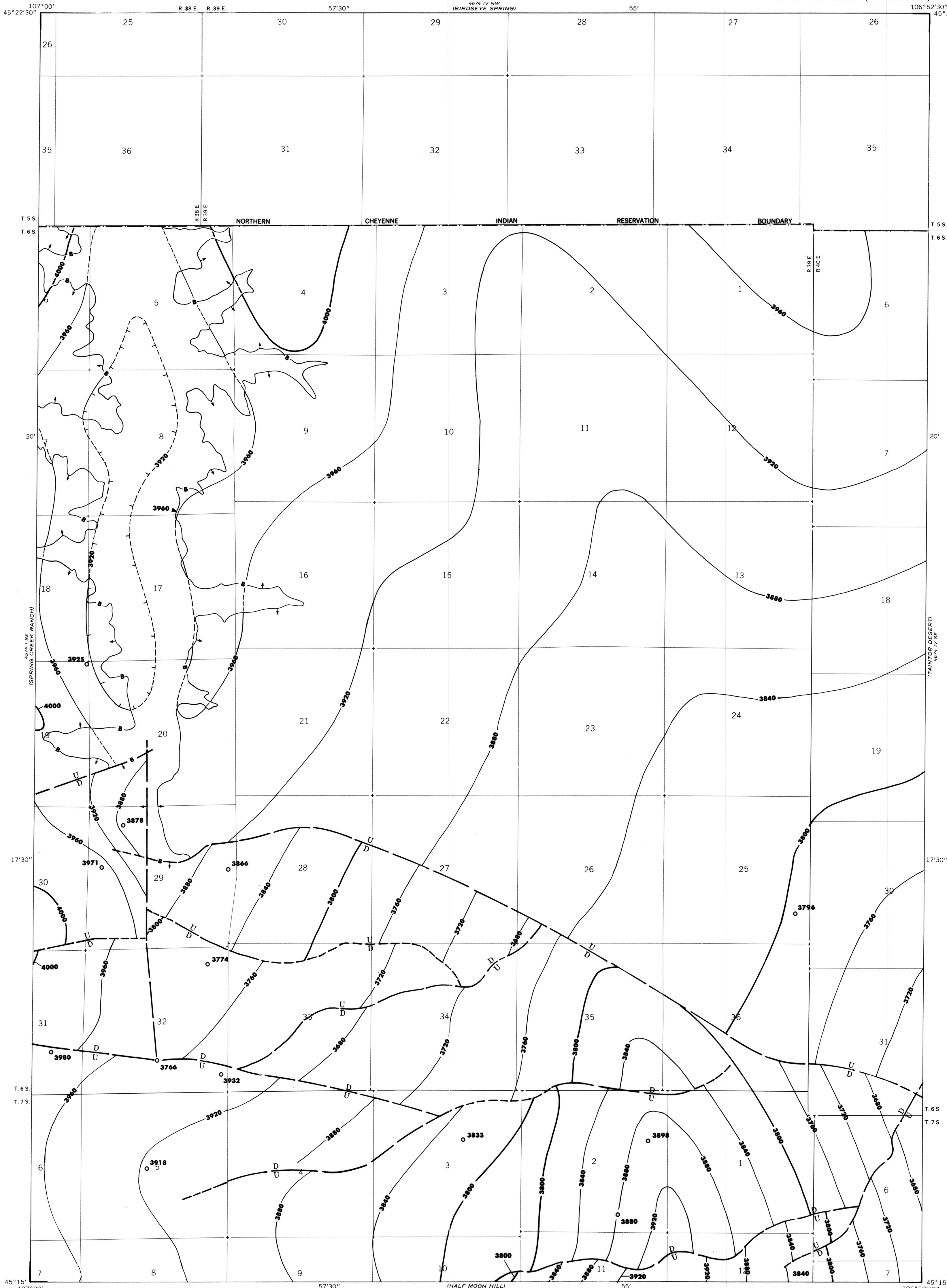


FAULT—Dashed where approximately located. U, up-thrown side; D, downthrown side.

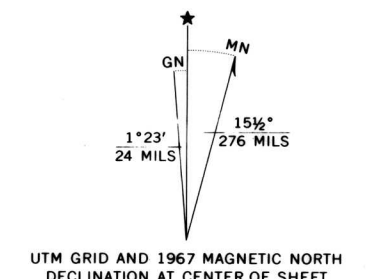
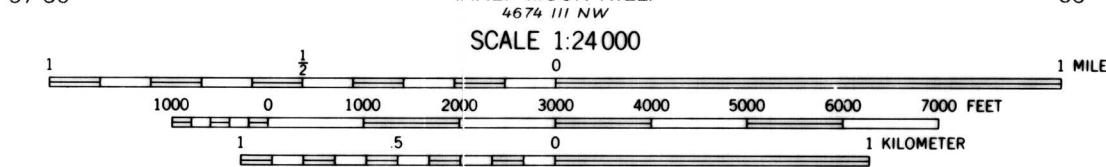


DRILL HOLE—Showing altitude at the top of the coal bed, in feet.
