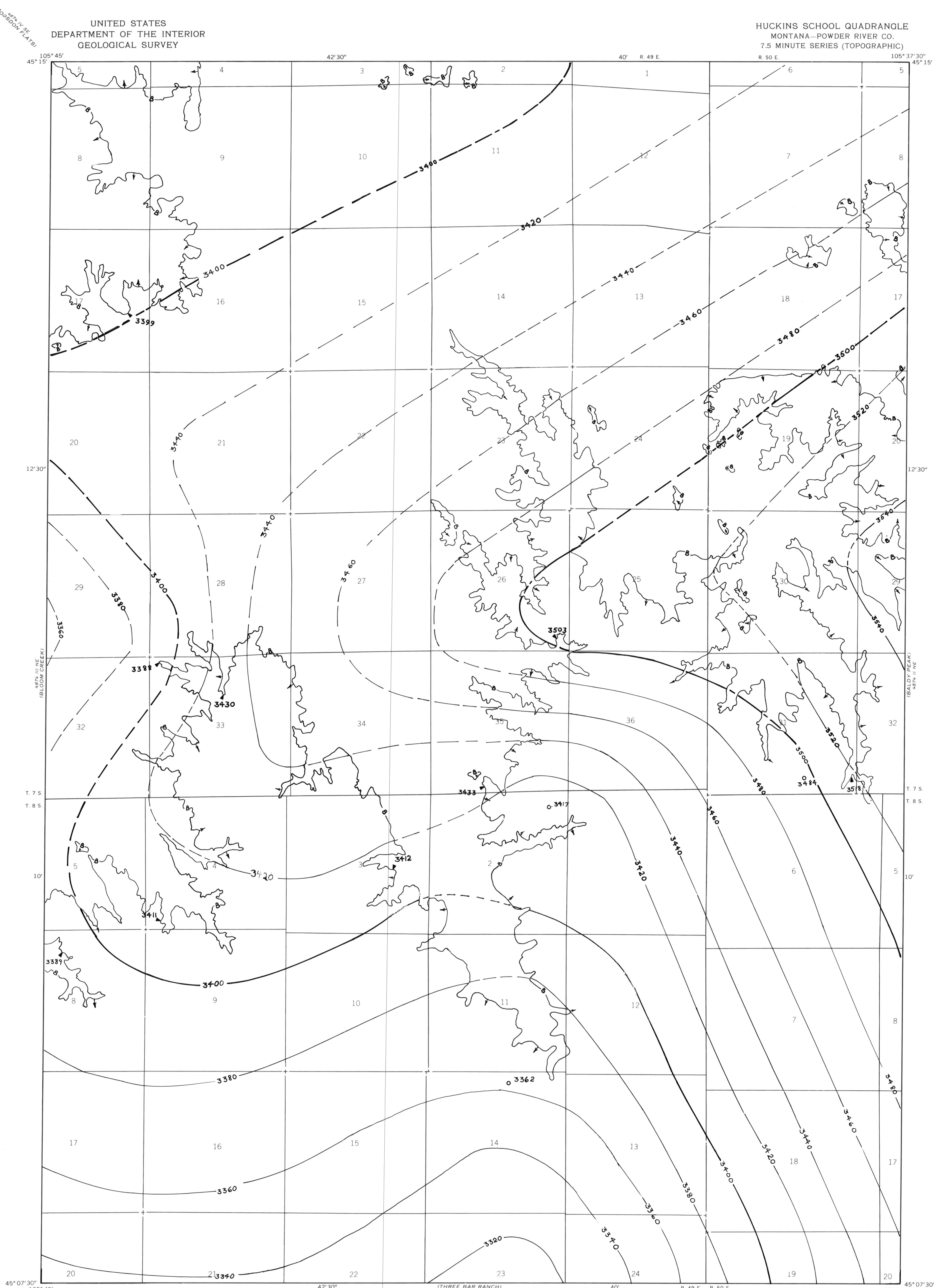

Arrows point toward the coal-bearing area. Number at triangle is altitude, in feet, at the top of the coal bed taken from topographic map at a point of coal thickness measurement.

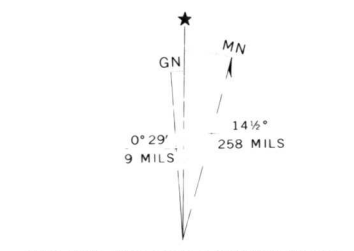
