

EXPLANATION

ISOPACHS OF THE COAL BED—Showing thickness, in feet. Dashed where projected beyond boundary of coal. Isopach interval 1 foot.

STRUCTURE CONTOURS—Drawn on the top of the coal bed. Dashed where projected beyond boundary of coal. Contour interval 20 feet (6.1 m). Datum is mean sea level.



BOUNDARY OF COAL DEPOSIT—Drawn along the outcrop of the coal bed and/or the contact between burned and unburned coal (dashed where inferred by present author beyond the limits of original data). Arrows point toward the coal-bearing area.

DRILL HOLE—Showing thickness and altitude at the top of the coal bed, in feet.

To convert feet to meters, multiply feet by 0.3048.
