


AREA OF LOW COAL-DEVELOPMENT POTENTIAL -  
Area contains coal in beds 5 feet (1.5 m)  
or more thick at depths ranging from 2,000  
to 3,000 feet (610 to 914 m).



AREA OF UNKNOWN COAL-DEVELOPMENT POTENTIAL -  
Area contains no known coal in beds 5 feet  
(1.5 m) or more thick, but coal-bearing  
units are present in area at depth of less  
than 3,000 feet (914 m).
