


EXPLANATION


-  NON-FEDERAL COAL LAND - Land for which the Federal Government does not own the coal rights, and for which the coal-development potential is not rated.
-  AREA OF MODERATE COAL-DEVELOPMENT POTENTIAL - Area contains coal in beds 5 feet (1.5 m) or more thick at depths ranging from 1,000 to 2,000 feet (305 to 610 m).
-  AREA OF LOW COAL-DEVELOPMENT POTENTIAL - Area contains coal in beds 5 feet (1.5 m) or more thick at depths ranging from 2,000 to 3,000 feet (610 to 914 m).
-  AREA OF UNKNOWN COAL-DEVELOPMENT POTENTIAL - Area contains (1) no known coal in beds 5 feet (1.5 m) or more thick, but coal-bearing units are present in area at depth of less than 3,000 feet (914 m) or (2) contains coal in beds 5 feet (1.5 m) or more thick, dipping in excess of 15°.
