


COMPOSITE COLUMNAR SECTION



The upper part of Lewis Shale, including Dad Sandstone, Fox Hills Sandstone, Lance Formation, and lower part of Fort Union Formation are not exposed but are in subsurface in southwestern part of quadrangle. Subsurface data is not available in quadrangle to estimate thicknesses of these formations for the composite columnar section. The Browns Park Formation overlies with angular unconformity all older stratigraphic units.





