



EXPLANATION

Gravity station and complete Bouguer anomaly value to 0.1 mgal without decimal point. Some gravity stations and values are not shown to improve clarity. All gravity data were reduced for a density of 2.67 g/cm³ using the International Gravity Formula of 1930 (Swick, 1942, p. 61) and referenced to the gravity datum of Wollard and Rose (1963). Terrain corrections for all stations extend to a radius of 166.7 km. Principal facts for all 4,915 gravity stations are available (Tang and Ponce, 1982).

Complete Bouguer anomaly contours, dashed or queried in areas of poor control. Contour intervals 5 and 25 mgals. A "+" indicates closed gravity high, "-" indicates closed gravity low. Hachures shown on all closed lows.
