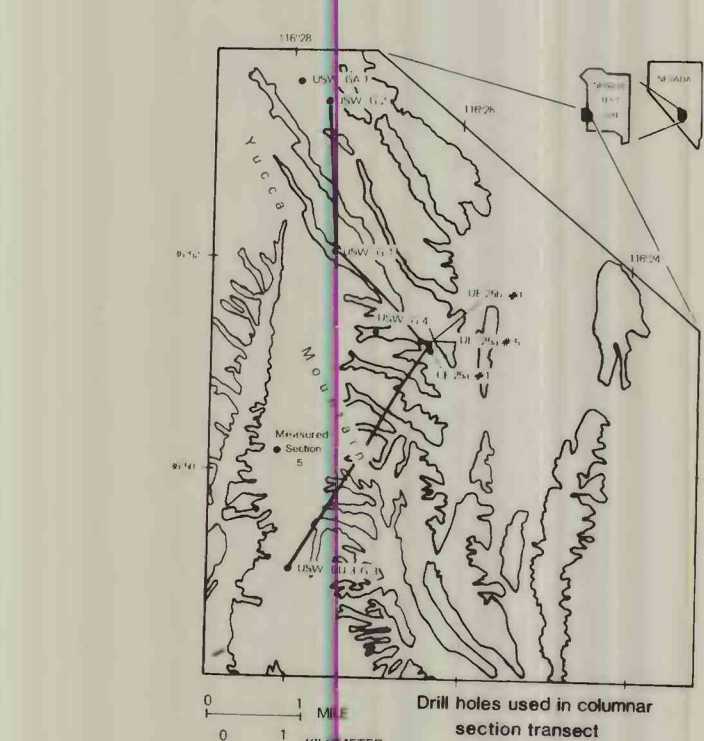
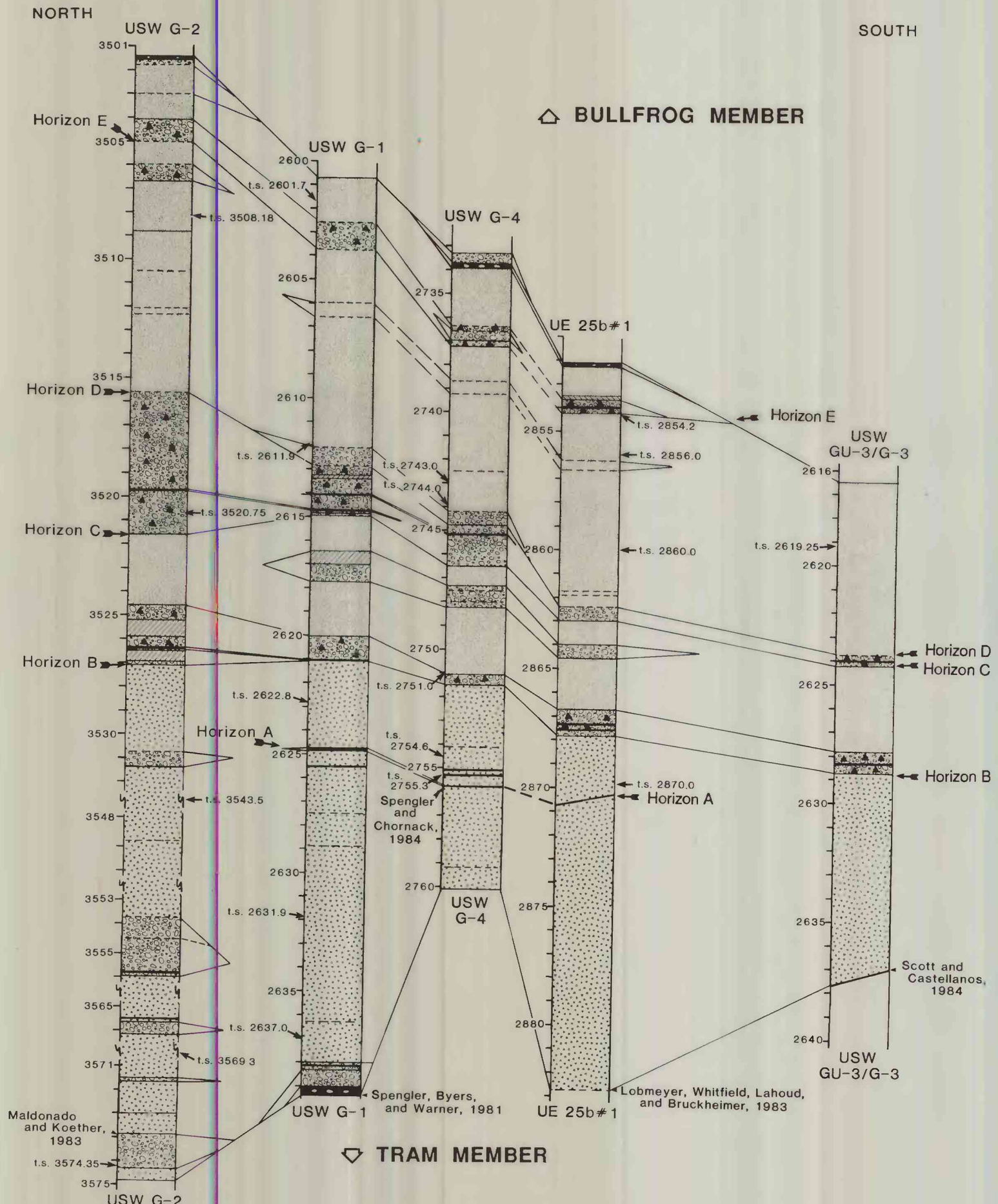
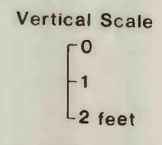


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**EXPLANATION**

- weathered pyroclastics, upper surface commonly oxidized, red to brown
- pyroclastic fall
- pyroclastic fall, coarse-grained, pumice rich
- pyroclastic flow, weathered, unit contains platy clay rinds around grains, comminuted crystal material in matrix
- pyroclastic surge, convoluted bedding in silty ash layers
- silty to very fine ash beds within a unit
- no sample available
- local, dipping fault
- solid line represents a distinct depositional break
- - - dashed line denotes a texture or color change within a unit, or a gradational contact
- t.s. thin section sample location
- h h homogeneous section omitted
