




EXPLANATION

Survey centerline of original workings, showing survey stations
- Specified outline of tunnel workings
Actual shape was somewhat irregular. The center strip represents plan view of the back (roof); two side strips represent projections of the wall, moved outward from back and laid flat. (Walls of room A, east wall of room B, and parts of walls that overlap not shown)
- Bedding plane of rocks
Numbers refer to beds mentioned in text. Strike is shown by plan of back; the dip is shown in projections of walls
- Fractures and faults
Dip and strike shown in same manner as for bedding planes except that vertical dips are shown by small red circles
