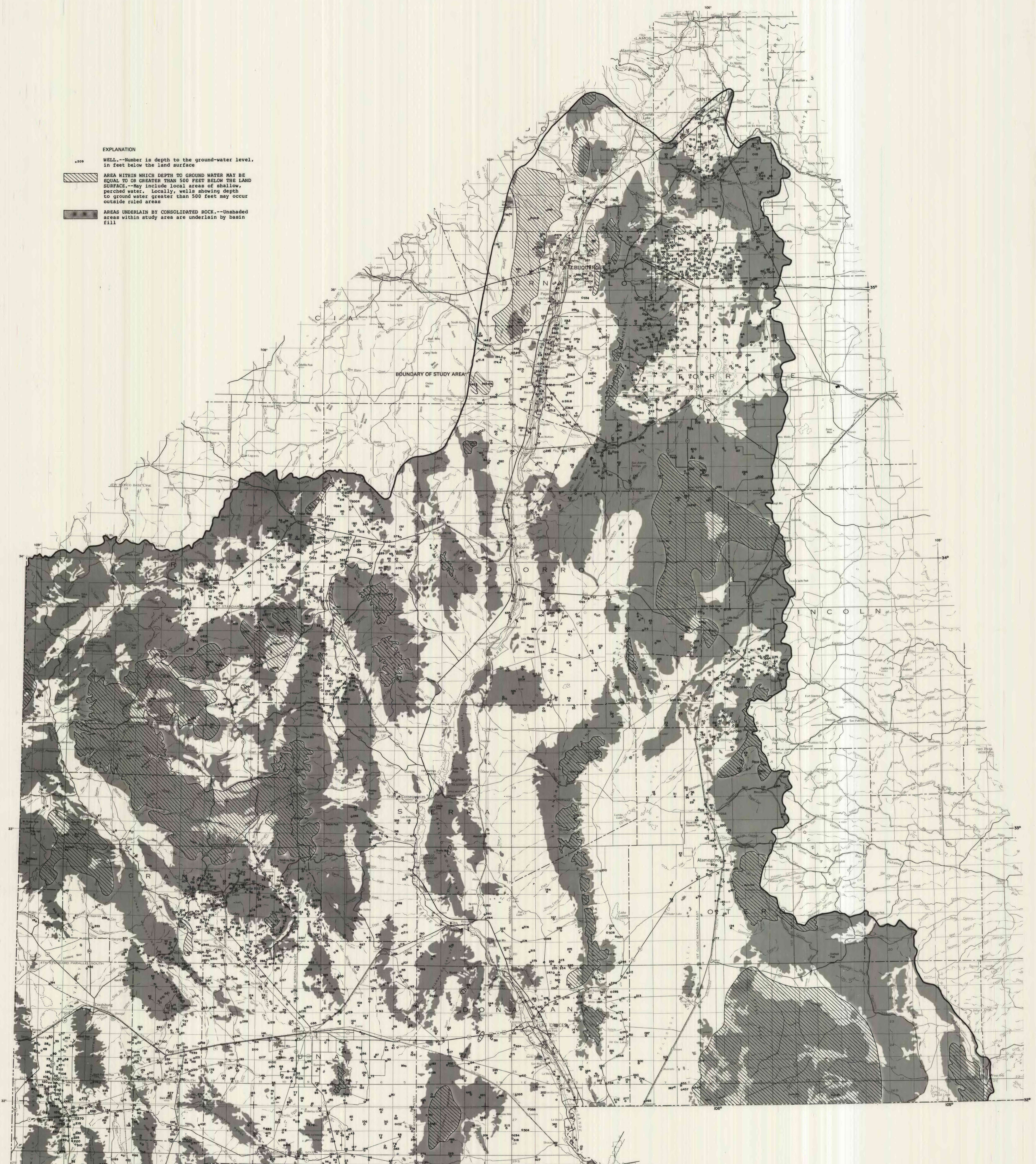


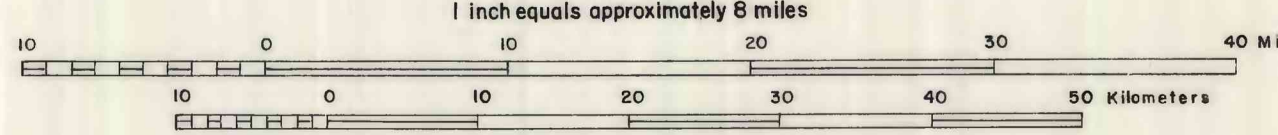
EXPLANATION

- WELL.--Number is depth to the ground-water level, in feet below the land surface
- AREA WITHIN WHICH DEPTH TO GROUND WATER MAY BE EQUAL TO OR GREATER THAN 500 FEET BELOW THE LAND SURFACE.--May include local areas of shallow, perched water. Locally, wells showing depth to ground water greater than 500 feet may occur outside ruled areas
- AREAS UNDERLAIN BY CONSOLIDATED ROCK.--Unshaded areas within study area are underlain by basin fill
